Tiger steams to PGA victory

Woods survives charges from Els and Austin to win by two shots

TULSA, Okla. — A season of first-time major winners ended with a familiar champion — Tiger Woods, who seems to win them all.



Challenged only briefly Sunday along the back nine of steamy Southern Hills, Woods captured the PGA Championship to win at least one major for the third straight season and run his career total to 13 as he moves closer to the standard set by Jack Nicklaus.

Woods closed with a 1-under 69 for a two-shot victory over Woody Austin, a gritty journeyman whose consolation prize was earning a spot on the U.S. team for the Presidents Cup.

Peering at the Top

CHARLOTTESVILLE — Every time he found the football in his hands the last two years, Virginia tailback Cedric Peerman had a vision of how the play should end. It most likely resembled his best runs at William Campbell High, with him nimbly racing away from defenders, nothing in his line of sight but green turf and an inviting end zone.

Now a seasoned fourth-year junior, the elder statesman of UVA's young but talented stable of running backs, Peerman has changed his tune.

"Sometimes I just got impatient and tried to show the coach that I can hit that home run ball," he said at Virginia's media day on Sunday. "But being a running back is about being patient, having vision, just getting four yards when you can."

"That's a good college football play: four yards. A lot of people don't realize this."

Hillcats record rare sweep of Indians

Hillcats manager Jeff Branson had his beliefs, but they were often contradicted by reality.

He believed his team was as good as any in the Carolina League. But it spent much of the year underperforming, so much so that the Hillcats have made last place in the Carolina

League's Northern Division a near-permanent home during the season's second half.

Then came a three-game sweep of Kinston, capped by the Hillcats' come-from-behind 11-9 victory Sunday night. The outcome of the series was stunning for two reasons. One, the Indians made it through the first four-plus months of the season without being swept by anyone in the Carolina League.
